What is an Automotive Skills Alliance (ASA)?

(ASA) is a European - wide stakeholder partnership for collaboration and networking on: (1) re-/up-skilling of workers and their training; (2) development of intelligence and fostering dialogue among all relevant partners and stakeholders; and (3) overall Skills Agenda in the Automotive-mobility ecosystem. Launched in November 2020 and established as a legal entity (non-profit organisation) in January 2022.
